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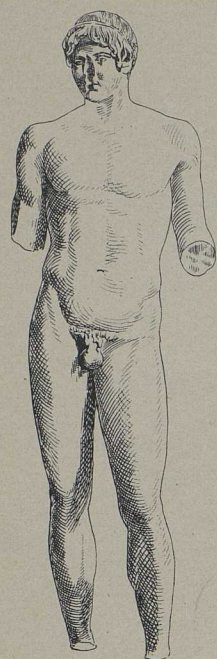

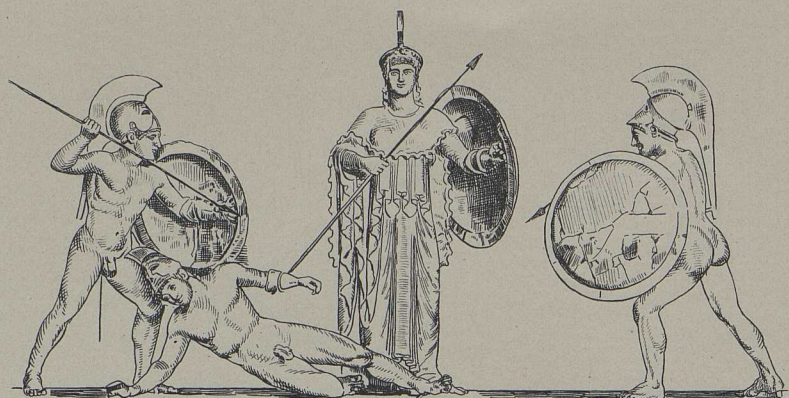

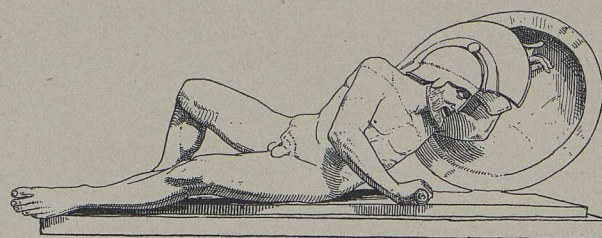

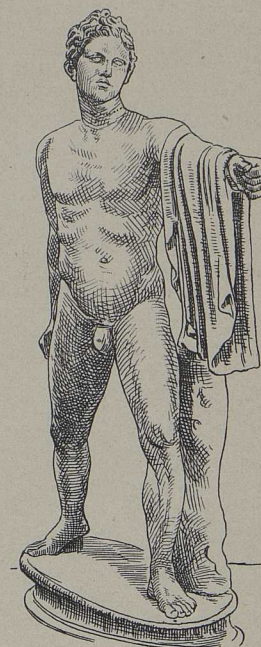
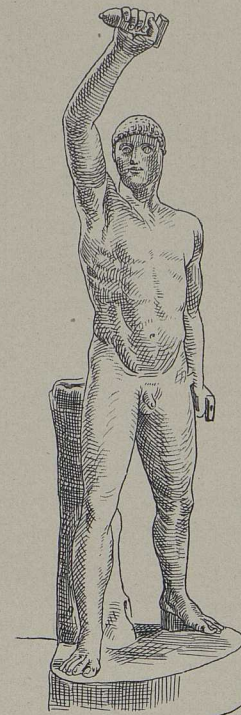
2. Apollo v. Piombino (Bronze im Louvre) [S. 601].



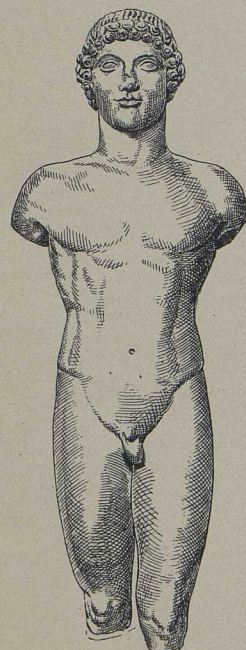

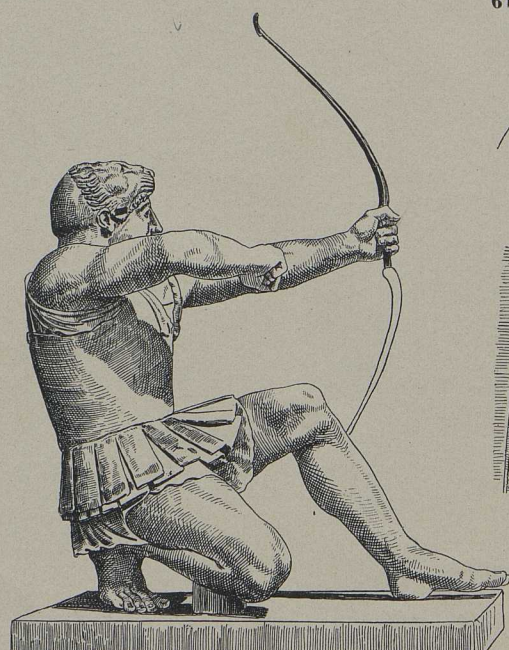

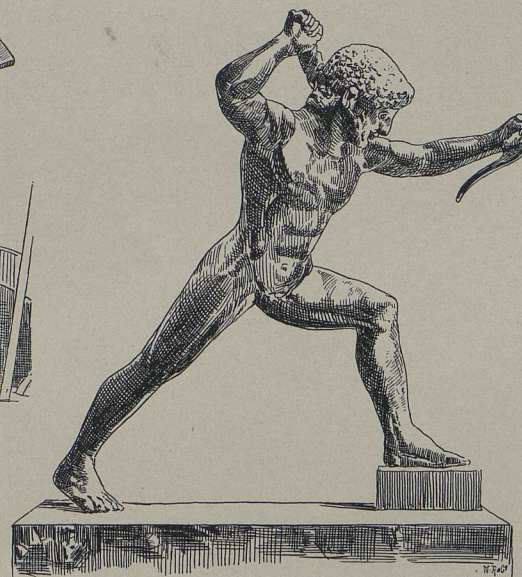
