A Recruiter and his Capture in the City.—A well-dressed young man willingly assents to the recruiting sergeant's arguments.



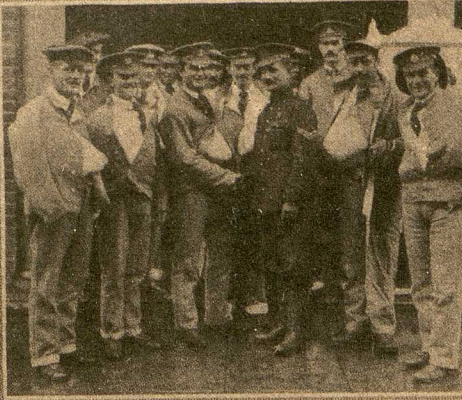
"Now, My Lad, You Can't Ignore that."—Corporal Hall, the army ex-champion boxer, gains a recruit—a former team conductor.
